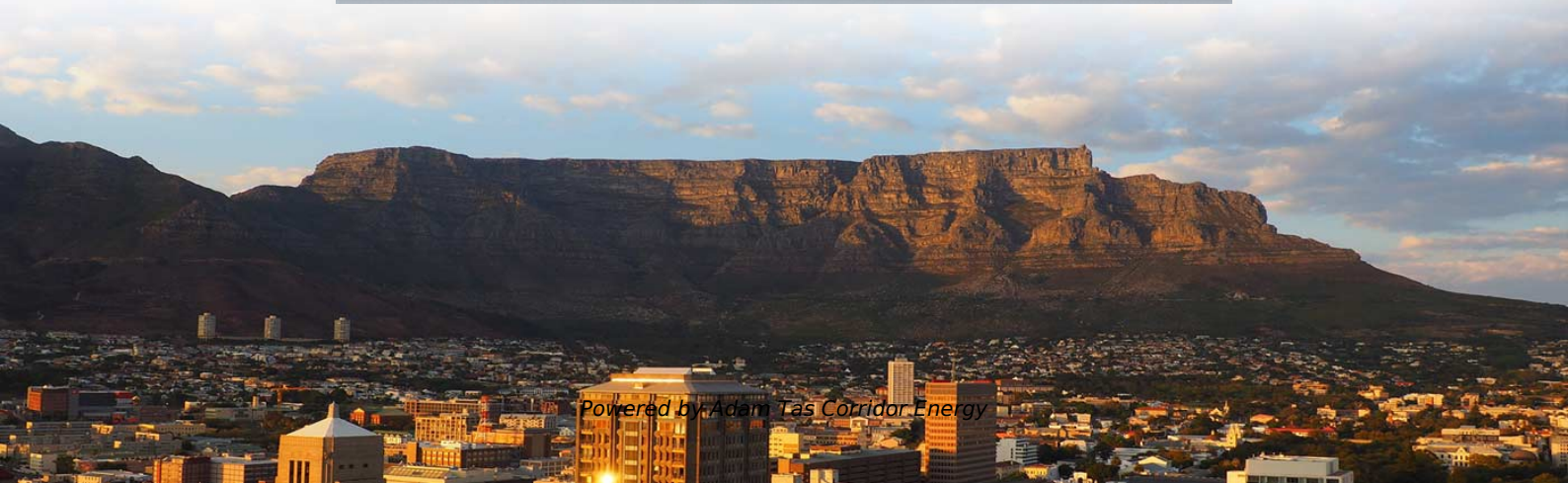

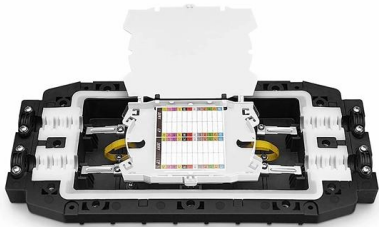


Overview

If pulled too tightly, the zip tie will damage the cable's core and/or outer cladding. Use Fiber-Safe Accessories Whenever possible, use accessories specifically designed for fiber optic cables, such as. Cable labels should always be included as a key step for routine change management documentation and standard operating procedures. Where reels are supplied with protective material fitted over the cable, the protection should remain in place until the cable will be installed.
