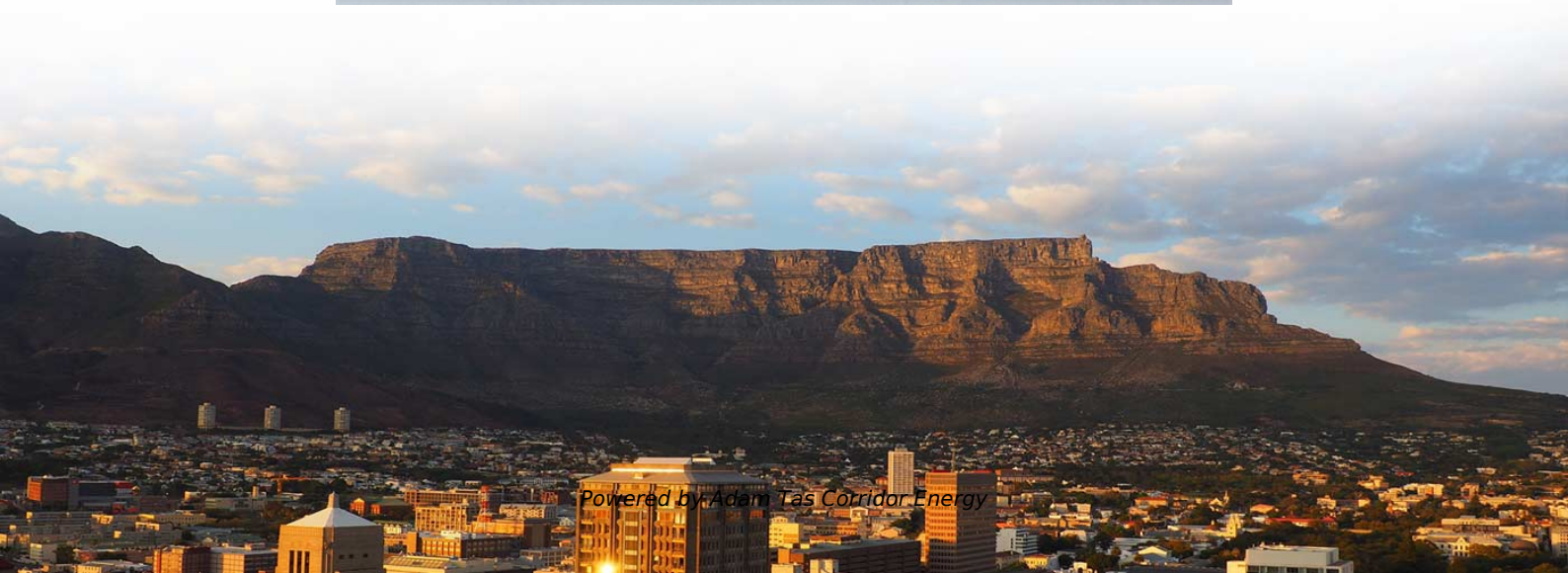
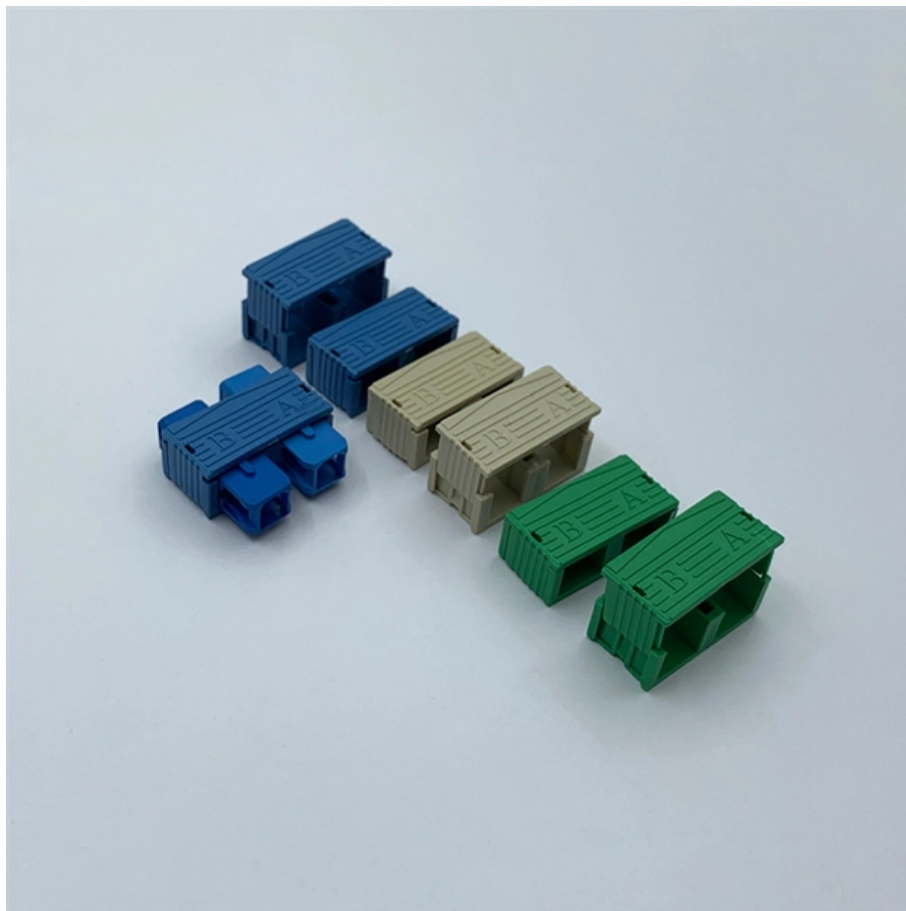

Regulations that distribution boxes must not be obstructed





Overview

The National Electrical Code (NEC), published as NFPA 70, sets minimum safety standards for electrical junction boxes in residential and commercial buildings. Working space is not required in back of assemblies such as dead-front switchboards or motor control centers where there are no renewable or adjustable parts such as fuses or switches on the back and where all connections are accessible from locations other than the back. For any professional aiming for a C-10 license or working in commercial construction, Understanding NEC Article 314: The Protocol is a core technical requirement. Yet the distribution box is a highly complex component that not only ensures safe power distribution, but is also responsible for protection in an emergency. In this article, you will learn everything you need to know about installing, expanding or replacing a distribution box - from the legal. Every state has adopted some version of the NEC, though the specific edition in force and any local amendments depend on your jurisdiction's. Especially in certain areas, improper operations during installation may lead to serious consequences.

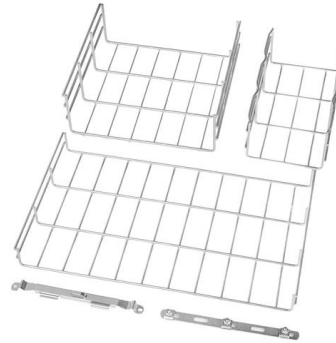

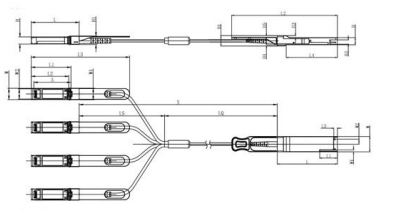

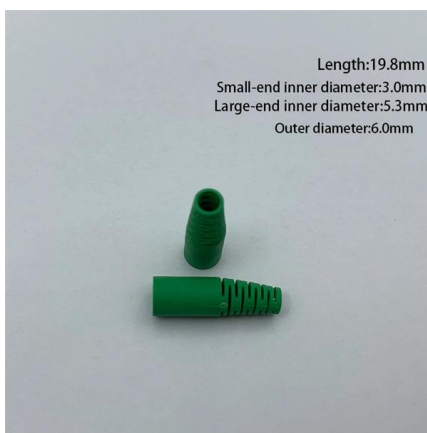
