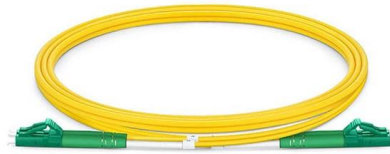

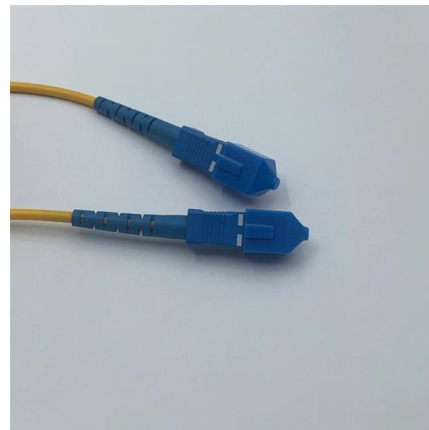

The height of a rack can vary from a few inches, such as in a broadcast console, to a floor mounted rack whose interior is 45 rack units (78.75 inches / 200 centimetres) high. Many wall-mounted industrial

Rack specifications

The rack or cabinet must meet the EIA Standard EIA-310-D for 19-inch racks. The front rack opening must be 451 mm wide + 0.75 mm (17.75 in. + 0.03 in.), and the rail-mounting holes must be 465 mm



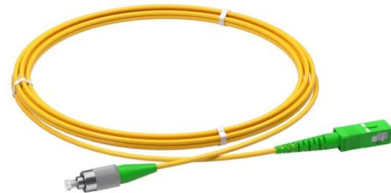

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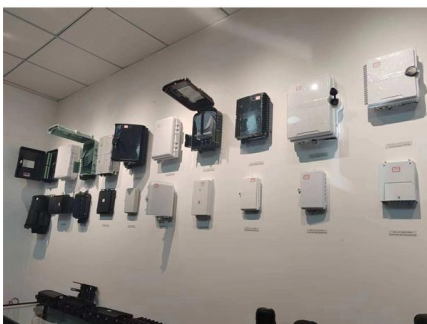

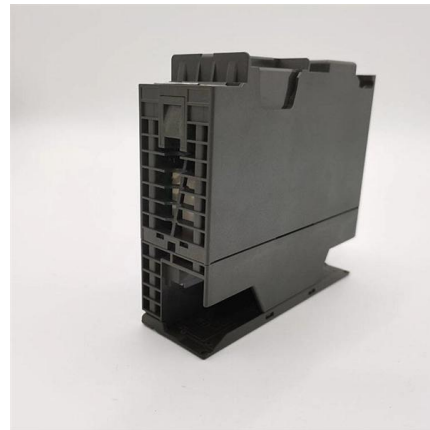
