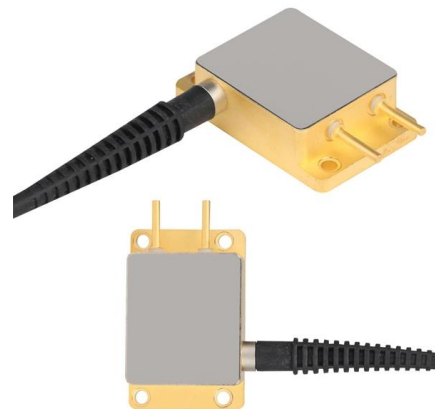


FIBER OPTIC CONSTRUCTION STANDARDS

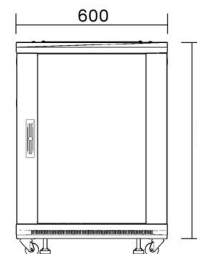
